Regulations governing the Publication Prize in Irish History

The National University of Ireland is pleased to invite applications for the NUI Publication Prize in Irish History, offered for competition in 2017.

1. Value of the Prize

The Prize, valued at €3,000, will be awarded for the best new work of Irish historical research published as a first publication by a graduate of the National University of Ireland.

2. Eligibility

- 2.1. Applicants will be graduates of doctoral status (awarded no earlier than 1 January 2012), holding any degree of the National University of Ireland and will be established historians in their field of expertise.
- 2.2. Applications are welcome from members of staff of the constituent universities, Recognised Colleges or Colleges linked with a constituent university of NUI who fulfil the eligibility criteria.
- 2.3. Works eligible to be considered for the 2017 Prize will have been published as a first sole author book, following conferral of a doctoral degree on the applicant, in the period April 2014 to March 2017. Works previously entered for the Prize are not eligible for consideration.
- 2.4. The work submitted for this Prize should be substantial and must be of an original character indicating direct research in historical records.

3. Application Procedure

Application forms are available to download at www.nui.ie/awards and should be submitted with the following:

- 3.1. Six copies of the publication in hard-copy;
- 3.2. Curriculum Vitae: to include academic and other relevant achievements to date.

4. Selection Process

A Panel of experts representing each of the constituent universities and chaired by the NUI Chancellor will make a recommendation to the Senate on the awarding of the Prize. The decision of the Senate will be final.

5. Lodgement of Documents

- 5.2. **The closing date for receipt of applications is Friday, 28 April 2017.**
