NUI is pleased to offer a one-year Post-Doctoral Fellowship valued at €40,000 for competition. This Fellowship will be based in the NUI offices in Dublin.

Background

The NUI Dr Garret FitzGerald Post-Doctoral Fellowship in the Social Sciences was established to honour the memory of the late Chancellor of NUI, who died in 2011. The Fellowship is offered to support the work of the NUI Education and Society Committee. Through that Committee, NUI seeks to pursue a discursive role in Irish society by promoting research, debate and discussion of major issues, and in addition, to promote the advancement of Higher Education.

Eligibility

The successful candidate must be a graduate of doctoral status (awarded since 1 January 2013), and hold any degree from NUI. This can be a Bachelor's Degree, Master's Degree or Doctoral Degree.

Applications

A wide variety of proposals are welcome under the broad area of Higher Education. This includes proposals from all Social Science disciplines, including Business Studies and cross/inter-disciplinary studies.

Applications for research are particularly encouraged on, but not limited to, The Irish University in the 21st Century.
