Regulations governing the NUI Dr Mary L Thornton Scholarship and Prize in Education

The National University of Ireland is pleased to invite applications for the Dr Mary L Thornton Scholarship and Prize in Education, offered for competition in 2019. The Scholarship and Prize will be awarded on the basis of a common competition and are offered biennially and are funded by a bequest from the late Dr Thornton.

1. Value of Scholarship and Prize

The value of the Scholarship is €6,000 and the value of the Prize is €1,000.

2. Objectives

This Scholarship and Prize is intended to encourage postgraduate research in the field of Education in a constituent university, Recognised College or a College linked with a constituent university of NUI. The University would wish, through the Scholarship and Prize, to encourage research related to Irish higher education and accordingly, preference will be given to applications in this area. However, applications will be accepted in relation to projects in any area of educational research.

3. Eligibility

- 3.1 Candidates must have been accepted, or have applied for admission, to a research degree at doctoral level in the field of Education in a constituent university or recognised college or college linked with a constituent university of NUI.
- 3.2 Candidates who previously submitted an application for this scholarship and were unsuccessful may only re-apply on one further occasion.

4. Application Procedure

Application forms are available to download at www.nui.ie/awards and should be submitted with the following documentation:

- 4.1 **Research Proposal:** Candidates are required to submit a detailed statement (max. 3000 words) concerning the research, which they propose to undertake during the tenure of the Scholarship.
The statement should include:
 - (i) the proposed topic of the research;
 - (ii) the proposed nature, scope and methodology of the research;
 - (iii) a preliminary literature review;
 - (v) where the research will be conducted and reasons for choosing that centre;
- 4.2 **Curriculum Vitae:** to include academic and other relevant achievements to date.
- 4.3 **Certified Academic Transcripts:** to be submitted for each degree and diploma awarded.
- 4.4 **Reports of two Academic Referees:** a specific NUI report form (available at www.nui.ie/awards) is to be completed by the referee(s) and (i) returned to the candidate in a sealed envelope or (ii) emailed directly to awards@nui.ie. It is the responsibility of the candidate to ensure that the references are submitted to NUI by their referees by the closing date. If references are not submitted by the closing date, a candidate's application may be deemed ineligible for consideration.

5. Selection Process

- 5.1 The NUI Registrar and designated NUI staff will administer the competition for the Dr Mary L Thornton Scholarship and Prize in Education.
- 5.2 Depending on the number of applications, a shortlisting process may be adopted, in which case not all candidates will be called for interview.
- 5.3 Where a shortlisting process is adopted, two independent subject specialists will assess the research proposal of each candidate. The reports of the subject specialists will be made available to the NUI Registrar and will inform the decision on the shortlisting of candidates for interview.
- 5.4 Shortlisted candidates will be interviewed by a Selection Panel to be appointed by NUI.
- 5.5 The Selection Panel will consist of the Heads of Departments/Schools in Education, or their representatives, from each of the constituent universities and will be chaired by an independent specialist. Additional expert(s) may be invited by NUI to sit on a Panel, if required.
- 5.6 The full application and subject specialist reports (where a shortlisting process is adopted) for each shortlisted candidate will be made available to the Selection Panel in advance of the interviews.
- 5.7 Following the interviews, the Selection Panel will finalise its recommendations to the NUI Registrar on the awarding of the Scholarship and Prize. The NUI Registrar will inform the successful candidate in writing of the Senate's decision regarding the awarding of the Scholarship and Prize.
- 5.8 Candidates whose applications are unsuccessful will be informed of the outcome in writing and offered feedback on the assessment of their application (where applicable).
- 5.9 The decision of the Senate on the awarding of the Studentship and Prize will be final.
- 5.10 NUI has an Appeals Process in place to guarantee that the University has acted fairly and reasonably, and followed the appropriate steps in its selection process. Further details can be found on the NUI website.
- 5.11 The candidates who are awarded the Scholarship and Prize will be required to present one copy of the completed research to the National University of Ireland.
